This is not even a complete list of the many senior roles Elaine has held or organisations of which she has been an active member.



Learning for Life Program - Jean C.

As we begin 2024 a survey of 2,200 parents of children sponsored by the Smith Family found that 9 out of 10 are worried to some degree about being able to afford all the things their children will need for school in 2024. As well as the basic uniforms and shoes, one of the most concerning findings is that their children are likely to miss out on digital devices. Laptops and internet are as essential as pens and papers in the 21st century classroom. This brings home how vital our sponsorship is for struggling families.


