PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Food for thought from The Smith Family CEO ...

Our new motto, *Learn today, change tomorrow*, is the story that connects our purpose and our organisational strategy with our goal to have 100,000 Australian children and young people living in poverty on our sponsorship program, *Learning for Life*.

The Smith Family has also committed to ensuring all *Learning for Life* students are equipped with digital tools and skills, and have access to reliable internet by 2027, a necessity for a 21st century education. Currently, 1 in 6 students it supports, do not have access to digital resources or the internet at home.

"Being digitally included is now an essential part of every child's education experience – so ensuring children from disadvantaged backgrounds have the same level of access to digital devices – and the training to use them – as their more advantaged classmates, is a priority for The Smith Family," Mr Taylor said.

"This is an absolute must-do and aligned to that is our investment in technology and data. This will be vital if we are to ensure every child whose life we touch can make their way out of poverty."

"This year [2022] marked The Smith Family's centenary, and as we embark on our next one hundred years, we must continue to adapt, use evidence to improve our outcomes, and work closely with those we support and those who help us, so we can effectively meet the challenges of our time," said Mr Taylor.
