Key milestones 1960-1969

1960 – 24 February: swearing in of the first committee

1960 – 30 March: first VIEW Club established at Balgowlah with Mrs Ellen Milverton as the first VIEW President

1960 - 10 November: first VIEW Clubs' Combined Luncheon

1962 – 8 May: first VIEW Convention held at Mark Foy's Empress Ballroom, attended by 450 members of Club Committees, including the 15 District Presidents

1962 – 29 May State Council formed, including inaugural State President, Sally Robinson

1964 – 12 October: First evening club formed – St George Evening Club

1966 – Voice of VIEW: Women were encouraged to debate and raise resolutions on matters of public concern, which could then be forwarded through their clubs for debate at the Annual Convention.

1968 – Friendship Month introduced by State President Doris Ellis and was enthusiastically embraced by the clubs.

1969 - Delegates attend 'The National Council of Women' 1969.
