As a member of VIEW you are one of over 14,000 women across 300 clubs who support the work of the Smith Family in their Learning for Life (LFL) program. LFL supports the education of more than 1500 disadvantaged young people and VIEW clubs raise more than \$1.2million dollars every year for the Smith Family.

And, our fantastic club raised over \$27,000 last year and in just 4 years we may be supporting 9 students if the proposed addition of two senior students is accepted. Looking forward to a big celebration birthday...

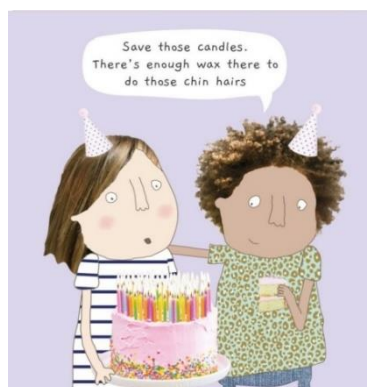
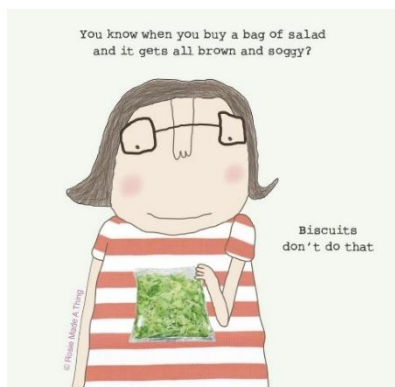
